

GenkiJACS is one of the first Japanese schools in Japan to teach communicative Japanese for everyday life, rather than academic Japanese. Everything in our schools is organized around this central philosophy.

Our family-sized classrooms accommodate up to 8 people and are all air-conditioned. Our Tokyo school is in the grounds of the beautiful Hanazono shrine, minutes from the central Shinjuku Station. In Fukuoka, our school is a mere 5 minutes walk from the main station while in Kyoto we are few minutes walk from the famous Gyon district and in Nagoya we're at walking distance from Nagoya Station.

Standard Japanese



10 grammar lessons | 10 practice lessons

You won't get far in Japan without being able to speak the language. With this course, you will be using Japanese on a daily basis from the very first day. No matter how long you choose to study with us, our incredibly individualized approach to teaching will allow you to focus on improving your Japanese ability. We call it Standard Japanese, but there is nothing standard about it!

Plus Conversation Module



Adds 5 conversational lessons

This module adds five extra-small group lessons per week that focus on specialized, communicative Japanese, current affairs and vocabulary that can be hard to cover in standard classes. It will give you the tools you need to actually communicate with Japanese people daily.

Cultural Activities Module



Adds cultural activities on Saturdays

This module offers an opportunity to learn about Japanese culture while studying the language. You will experience things such as kimono-wearing, pottery, tea ceremony, calligraphy, Zen meditation, aikido, katana sword fighting, Shinto, Japanese customs and more!

Summer course for minors

学生ビザコース | student visa course

What is a student visa?

The student visa lets you stay in Japan for a year or more, and allows you to work part-time while you study. We will handle most of the process for you and provide support in English for any parts you have to do on your own. **Note: The student**

visa is only offered at our Fukuoka and Nagoya schools. If you are eligible for any other kind of long-term visa, such as a Working Holiday visa or spousal visa, you are welcome to study on this course in any school. Contact us for more details!

The course

The course is booked and paid in advance for 12 months; you'll have 20 classes per week - four per day. Two focus on grammar and the other two on applying your skills to real-world situations. There is a maximum limit of 8 students per class: by far the smallest of any accredited Japanese school. The course is only available to students at or below pre-intermediate level.

Starting dates and application deadlines

The course has 4 intakes each year: January, April, July and October. The student visa application also has very strict deadlines, but with 4 intakes, we are sure to have the time of the year that suits you!

You can study up to 2 years!

All classes are held on a rolling start basis meaning that when you arrive at GenkiJACS, you are placed into the ongoing class that is most appropriate for you. Your placement is decided based on an on-line test, followed by a confirmation test and an interview by a Japanese teacher on your first day at the school. If your Japanese ability is slightly below the level of your class, we will provide free materials and extra

homework to raise you to the appropriate level. As your study continues, you move up automatically through the class levels. For as long as you study with us, when you complete the material for one level, you will advance to the next level. Because we offer so many different class levels at any time, we can place you into a class that matches YOUR current ability level.

GenkiJACS Fukuoka and Nagoya are fully accredited by the Japanese government to provide student visas for long-term study. UNIVERSITY CREDIT

Your study with us may count toward your degree! We can meet many requirements your university may have: regular testing, grading; official transcripts and letters of recommendation.

BILDUNGSURLAUB

We are recognized by most German state authorities as eligible for up to an extra 10 days of educational leave, for courses requiring at least 30 hours of classes per week.

EXTRA ACTIVITIES

We offer a full program of social events and activities to make sure your free time is as fun as your study time! Here are some examples:

- City tour: Once a week new students are taken on a free tour around the city.
- Friday party: Every Friday we organize an event for our students. We could be going to a local restaurant, watching a movie at a cinema or attending a local night market...
- Outings: On some weekends we organize excursions to local festivals, shows and places interest. As an example, we regularly arrange private bus tours to nearby tourist destinations.
- Movie/game night: Once a week, students gather to watch a Japanese movie, or learn traditional Japanese games such as "hanafuda" from Japanese people.

HELP OUTSIDE OF THE SCHOOL


We are confident we offer an unparalleled level of support, thanks to our small size and to the close relationship we have with our students. We can help posting or receiving packages, reviewing Japanese resumes, booking transports and accommodations, making travel plans, opening a bank account and more. Being away from home can be scary, but we are here to make sure that it is not!

SERVICES FOR MINORS

- Airport pickup: Upon request, a representative from the school can be waiting at the airport to pick the student up and take them to their accommodation (extra charge applies).
- Weekly reports: For parents who require it, we provide weekly updates on student progress.
 These include information on academic achievement, interactions with the host family; activities that week and our observations.
- Japan is extremely safe, and that holds true for kids and teenagers, many of whom are using the trains and metro on their own. To make it even better, Genki JACS students under 16 all receive extra counseling and support from the school staff.
- Emergency contact numbers: We offer a 24-hour line that can be used by the student or parents calling from overseas.

Not all accommodation types suit everyone, but our accommodation coordinators will make sure that your lodgings match your preferences. Home stay

The opportunity to stay with a Japanese host family is the best way to immerse yourself in the culture and practice at "home" what you learned at school that day. We take into account your needs or preferences when arranging a host family for you. Your host family members are likely to be the people you become closest to during your stay, which is why we are extremely thorough when looking through all host family applicants, ensuring that they can provide a suitable environment to assist your learning and to allow you to experience Japan fully. You will have a private bedroom, but share the central facilities such as kitchen, bathroom and laundry with the apartment owners or the family. Available to students of all ages!

Guest house

A private room in a shared house with other GenkiJACS students and Japanese residents or university students, gives you the freedom to enjoy the city life, but also the chance to make lots of friends. We offer many guest houses dotted around the city in a variety of locations. Some are mixed-gender, some male or female students only. Guest houses are perfect for university students or young adults on a budget. Any student over the age of 18 can stay at a guest house.

Supervised Residence (Fukuoka only)

Our Supervised Residence is the perfect way for our younger students to experience a bit of independence while still being looked after. Breakfasts and dinners can be added so you have one less thing to worry about! You will have a private room but shared bathrooms and laundry facilities with other GenkiJACS students and some local Japanese students as well! Our Supervised Residence is perfect for students under the age of 18!

Private Apartment

Private one-room apartments are similar to a hotel room in quality, but much more spacious! They include a bed, living area; kitchen area, bathroom and all amenities needed for a simple life. Most private apartments are very centrally located and in Fukuoka, they are within easy walking distance of our school. Students over the age of 18 are welcome to stay in a private apartment.

FUKUOKA

Fukuoka was ranked the best city in Asia by Asiaweek magazine several times over, was chosen by Newsweek as one of the world's top 10 boomtowns, and has been ranked multiple times by Monocle Magazine as one of the most liveable cities in the world. Fukuoka is the capital of Fukuoka Prefecture and has a population of about 1.5 million people.



TOKYO

Tokyo does not need much introduction. It offers the best of the modern Japanese culture, an incredible range of entertainment choices not to mention places to visit: Tokyo Sky Tree, Akihabara, Harajuku and of course Shinjuku to name a few.

The population of Tokyo metropolis currently stands at around 39 million people, making it the biggest urban zone in the world.

KYOTO

Though no longer the capital of Japan, it remains her heart. Buddhist temples, Shinto Shrines, castles and gardens: to name all of them would take quite some time. Kyoto continues to be one of the best-preserved cities in the whole of Japan, which makes it a great destination if your goal is to touch the history of Japan.



NAGOYA

Nagoya is the 4th largest city of Japan after Tokyo and Osaka, located in the centre of Aichi prefecture, full of history. Birthplace of Toyota Motors, Nagoya is one of the nation's major manufacturing centers. With a great nightlife, lots of really good restaurants, and too many places to visit, you're sure to have a great time in Nagoya.

The Genki Route

Why choose when you can attend all schools?

The Genki Route allows you to study in more than one school, in one epic adventure through Japan. Start studying in Tokyo, and continue seemlessly in Kyoto or Fukuoka. Our teachers will make sure your transfer is smooth, and there's no extra fee.

for every student. If you're eligible for student visa and stay for a year or more, it's even possible to try our Nagoya combined with our Fukuoka school.

With Student Visa

Stay several weeks in our Tokyo, Fukuoka or Kyoto schools. [Our Nagoya school is not eligible at the moment.]
